Founded in 1935, by Miss Isobel Travers and Miss Audrey Morphett, Fahan School is an independent, non-denominational school for girls from Kindergarten to Year 12. Fahan is located on a stunning 6.2 hectare campus in the attractive Hobart suburb of Sandy Bay - a ten minute drive from Hobart's CBD.

Located on one campus together, Fahan students enjoy state-of-the-art facilities, spectacular grounds, a nurturing wellbeing program and have an outstanding academic record.

Fahan School provides a strong academic program within a friendly, inclusive culture. Our mission is to create a community in which all people flourish. To coordinate the Senior School Outdoor Education program.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

In this role you will need to manage and provide for an age and stage appropriate Outdoor Education program with adventure opportunities that are aligned to the teaching and learning and pastoral care of students (Years 7-12).

Fahan School's Outdoor Education Program ignites young hearts and minds by focusing on experiential learning with the aim of cultivating courage, positive self-evaluation and relational development. Fahan students foster a deep connection to nature and a well-developed sense of place through local, national, and international experiences. The program is designed to support both the academic and pastoral programs, incorporating elements of Positive Education to enhance wellbeing. The Outdoor Education Camp Coordinator works with outdoor education specialists and teaching staff to design and deliver experiences and camps for students in Years 7-12. Fahan School has an Outdoor Education facility on Kelvedon Estate on the East Coast of Tasmania, which provides a venue for annual camps for Years 5, 7 and 9 students. The Outdoor Education Camp Coordinator provides significant contribution to the School's Lumina 9 program, which has a focus on experiential learning.

Primary Responsibilities

Outdoor Education Program Management

- Develop and implement a vision and supporting short, medium and longer term goals for the program that is aligned to the broader strategic direction of the School.
- In the context of the whole-school teaching and learning program, contribute to the development and lead the implementation of strategic goals and imperatives relevant to the program and curriculum area.
- Develop and implement an age and stage appropriate program that is aligned to the teaching and learning and pastoral care needs of students from Years 7-12.
- For each outdoor education activity, manage the procedures associated with the successful planning and implementation of each activity including communication with students, staff and parents. Manage risk assessments, taking into account individual student needs, including subsequent logistical arrangements.

Work, Health and Safety (WHS)

- Comply with the requirements of all applicable Work Health and Safety legislation and Fahan School Work Health and Safety policies and procedures.
- Provide expert guidance to support the effective development, implementation and review of the School's WHS Policy and procedures including, but not limited to, risk assessment, hazard and injury reporting, working at heights and electrical safety within an outdoor education setting.
- Oversee the implementation of the School's risk management processes for the outdoor education program.



Outdoor Education Camp Coordinator/Teacher Position Description

Financial, Asset And People Management

- Manage School resources in accordance with established budgets.
- Ensure that outdoor education program assets are registered, maintained, renewed and reviewed according to legislation requirements and school standards.
- Provide leadership and day-to-day support to all allocated outdoor education staff (teaching and support) to ensure that teaching and learning is of the highest quality.
- Provide support for the vocational traineeship position, regularly liaising with relevant representatives.
- Identify, promote and support relevant professional and personal development opportunities for all outdoor education staff (teaching and support).
- Understand and apply the School's Human Resources Policy and procedures when appropriate including, but not limited to, recruitment and engagement, performance management and rehabilitation.
- Management of our outdoor education facility at Kelvedon including liaison and communication with Kelvedon's owners.

Curriculum

- Understand and implement relevant educational standards such as but not limited to Australian Curriculum,
 Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA), The Office of Tasmanian Assessment, Standards and Certification
 (TASC)
- Ensure that the relevant teaching, learning, and assessment program meets all required external and School standards.
- Ensure that curriculum units are developed, implemented, and reviewed to ensure a high quality, relevant teaching and learning program.
- Be the School's representative at relevant curriculum and quality assurance events between co-operating schools and other external organisations.

Essential Requirements

- 1. Proven ability to inspire others and be an energetic leader within a teaching and learning community.
- 2. Teaching qualifications, experience and a demonstrated passion for outdoor education ventures such as rock climbing, mountain biking, bushwalking, coasteering, rafting or kayaking.
- 3. Community surf certificate or willingness to attain.
- 4. Experience successfully managing budgets, physical assets, people and their safety.
- 5. Ability to develop curriculum and demonstrate an understanding of curriculum standards and implement such standards within a relevant teaching and learning program.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to integrate contemporary information and communication technology (ICT) strategies into a teaching and learning program.
- 7. A current qualification for Wilderness First Aid (SISSS00126) or an equivalent qualification; or the ability to obtain such a qualification.



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- 8. Current Manual Driver's Licence (Medium Rigid) and the ability to drive a public passenger vehicle, or the ability to acquire such a licence and certificate.
- 9. A willingness to uphold the values of Fahan School and the School's Code of Conduct.
- 10. Lead, inspire and work co-operatively alongside others.
- 11. Demonstrated knowledge of workplace health and safety issues and how they apply to a school and outdoor educational environment.
- 12. Valid Working with Vulnerable Persons registration.
- 13. Satisfy requirements of a National Police Check.
- 14. Permanent Australian residency.

Selection Criteria

To be considered for this role candidates will need to address the following questions in the application. No more than two pages:

- 1. Based on your qualifications, experience, and personal capabilities, tell us why you would be an outstanding Outdoor Education Camp Coordinator. Please incorporate the following points:
- Be a qualified teacher, registered to teach, or be eligible to teach, within the State of Tasmania.
- Have the ability to lead, develop and deliver an engaging and highly effective teaching and learning program within an outdoor educational setting.
- Have the ability to take responsibility for the effective pastoral care of students, acting with kindness and empathy.
- Have the ability to work both independently and co-operatively with other staff members.
- Have highly developed decision making skills and good judgement in high pressure dynamic environments.
- 2. Describe why you believe Outdoor Education is an important part of the educational experience for students, particularly in relation to girls' education.

Remuneration

In accordance with the Fahan School Teachers Enterprise Agreement 2024.

This role encompasses a total of 160 days, which includes accrued time in lieu. Flexibility in scheduling is essential, as the number of days worked will vary according to the program's demands. The majority of your time will be concentrated during certain terms when most of the programs are either actively running or being organized. Additionally, the role requires you to develop and run the in various camps throughout the year, necessitating time away from the primary work location.
